## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States with respect to the right to life.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the
- 4 following article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of final passage
- 2 of this joint resolution:
- 3 "Article —
- 4 "Section 1. With respect to the right to life, the
- 5 word 'person' as used in this article and in the fifth and
- 6 fourteenth articles of amendment to the Constitution of
- 7 the United States applies to all human beings irrespective
- 8 of age, health, function, or condition of dependency, in-
- 9 cluding their unborn offspring at every stage of their bio-
- 10 logical development.
- "Section 2. No unborn person shall be deprived of
- 12 life by any person: *Provided, however,* That nothing in this
- 13 article shall prohibit a law permitting only those medical
- 14 procedures required to prevent the death of the mother.
- 15 "Section 3. The Congress and the several States
- 16 shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate leg-
- 17 islation."
