JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States regarding regulations on the amounts of expenditures of personal funds made by candidates for election for public office.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 for ratification:
- 3 "ARTICLE —
- 4 "Section 1. Congress and the several States may
- 5 enact laws regulating the amounts of expenditures a can-
- 6 didate for elective public office may make from personal
- 7 funds of the candidate or members of the candidate's im-
- 8 mediate family, including personal loans.".
