## JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States regarding the right of all citizens of the United States to an education of equal high quality.

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*  
3       *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-  
4       lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-  
5       stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all  
6       intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when  
7       ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several  
8       States:

1 “ARTICLE —  
2 “SECTION 1. All citizens of the United States shall  
3 enjoy the right to an education of equal high quality.  
4 “SECTION 2. The Congress shall have power to imple-  
5 ment this article by appropriate legislation.”.
