A BILL

 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Helpers Job Oppor-5 tunity Act".

6 SEC. 2. APPLICATION OF DAVIS-BACON ACT.

7 (a) GENERAL RULE.—Helpers of laborers and me-8 chanics shall be considered to be a separate classification

of laborers or mechanics for purposes of the Act of March 1 2 3, 1931 (commonly known as the "Davis-Bacon Act") (40 3 U.S.C. 276a et seq.). A helper of a laborer or mechanic 4 shall be paid the prevailing wage of helpers of laborers 5 or mechanics employed on projects which are of a character similar to the project on which the helper is em-6 ploved and which are in the same city, town, or other sub-7 8 division of the State (or District of Columbia) in which 9 the helper is employed.

10 (b) DEFINITION.—For purposes of subsection (a),
11 the term "helper" means a semi-skilled worker (other than
12 a skilled journeyman mechanic) who—

13 (1) works under the direction of and assists a14 journeyman;

15 (2) under the journeyman's direction and su-16 pervision, performs a variety of duties to assist the 17 journeyman such as preparing, carrying, and fur-18 nishing materials, tools, equipment, and supplies, 19 maintaining them in order, cleaning and preparing 20 work areas, lifting, positioning, and holding mate-21 rials or tools, and other related semi-skilled tasks as 22 directed by the journeyman; and

(3) may use tools of the trade at and under thedirection and supervision of the journeyman.
