A BILL

To eliminate the fees for Federal administration of State
supplementary SSI payments.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “SSI Benefit Protection
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF FEES FOR FEDERAL ADMINISTRA-**
2 **TION OF STATE SUPPLEMENTARY SSI PAY-**
3 **MENTS.**

4 (a) OPTIONAL STATE SUPPLEMENTARY PAY-
5 MENTS.—Section 1616(d) of the Social Security Act (42
6 U.S.C. 1382e(d)) is amended—

7 (1) in paragraph (1)—

8 (A) by striking “(1)”; and

9 (B) by striking “plus” and all that follows
10 through “(3)”; and

11 (2) by striking paragraphs (2), (3), and (4).

12 (b) MANDATORY STATE SUPPLEMENTARY PAY-
13 MENTS.—Section 212(b)(3) of Public Law 93–66 (42
14 U.S.C. 1382 note) is amended—

15 (1) in subparagraph (A)—

16 (A) by striking “(A)”; and

17 (B) by striking “plus” and all that follows
18 through “(C)”; and

19 (2) by striking subparagraphs (B), (C), and
20 (D).

21 (c) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

22 (1) Section 13731 of the Omnibus Budget Rec-
23 onciliation Act of 1993 (42 U.S.C. 1382e note) is
24 amended by striking subsection (b).

1 (2) Section 5102(b) of the Balanced Budget
2 Act of 1997 (42 U.S.C. 1382e note) is amended by
3 striking paragraph (2).

4 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
5 this section shall take effect at the end of the 30-day pe-
6 riod that begins with the date of the enactment of this
7 Act.

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
