## A BILL

- To require the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to require applicants for or holders of operating licenses for nuclear power reactors to have in effect an emergency response plan for an area within a 50-mile radius of the reactor.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Nuclear Emergency
  - 5 Assurance Reform Act of 1999".
  - 6 SEC. 2. EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLANS.
  - 7 The Nuclear Regulatory Commission shall revise its
  - 8 regulations applicable to any applicant for, or holder of,

- 1 an initial or renewed operating license for a nuclear power
- 2 reactor so that such applicant or holder will have to have
- 3 in effect an emergency response plan for an area within
- 4 a 50-mile radius of such reactor which provides a reason-
- 5 able assurance that adequate protective measures can and
- 6 will be taken in the event of a radiological emergency. In
- 7 the case of a holder of a license for such a reactor, the
- 8 Commission shall require the holder to provide the Com-
- 9 mission with such a plan within 180 days of receiving no-
- 10 tice of such requirement.
