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## A BILL

To remove certain restrictions on participation in the demonstration project conducted by the Secretary of Defense to provide health care for Medicare-eligible Department of Defense beneficiaries under the Federal Employees Health Benefits program.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. REMOVAL OF CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS ON PAR-**  
2 **TICIPATION BY ELIGIBLE BENEFICIARIES IN**  
3 **FEHBP DEMONSTRATION PROJECT.**

4 (a) REMOVAL OF NUMERICAL RESTRICTIONS.—Sec-  
5 tion 1108 of title 10, United States Code, is amended by  
6 striking the second sentence of subsection (a).

7 (b) REMOVAL OF GEOGRAPHIC RESTRICTIONS.—  
8 Such section is further amended—

9 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “and residing  
10 within one of the areas covered by the demonstration  
11 project”; and

12 (2) by striking subsection (c).

13 (c) ENROLLMENT PERIODS; TERMS OF ENROLL-  
14 MENT.—(1) Subsection (d)(2) of such section is amended  
15 by striking “an open enrollment period for the year 2000  
16 (conducted in the fall of 1999)” and inserting “open en-  
17 rollment periods for the years 2000, 2001, and 2002 (con-  
18 ducted in the fall of 1999, 2000, and 2001, respectively)”.

19 (2) Subsection (f)(1) of such section is amended by  
20 striking “who enrolls” and all that follows through “the  
21 termination of the project” and inserting “shall be as fol-  
22 lows unless the beneficiary disenrolls before the termi-  
23 nation of the project:

24 “(A) For an eligible beneficiary who enrolls in  
25 the demonstration project during the open enroll-  
26 ment period for the year 2000, 3 years.

1 “(B) For an eligible beneficiary who enrolls in the  
 2 demonstration project during the open enrollment period  
 3 for the year 2001, 2 years.

4 “(C) For an eligible beneficiary who enrolls in the  
 5 demonstration project during the open enrollment period  
 6 for the year 2002, 1 year.”.

7 (d) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—(1) Such section  
 8 is further amended—

9 (1) by redesignating subsections (d) through (l)  
 10 as subsections (c) through (k), respectively; and

11 (2) in subsection (j) (as redesignated by para-  
 12 graph (1)), by striking “subsection (j)(2)” and in-  
 13 serting “subsection (i)(2)”.

14 (2) Section 8906 of title 5, United States Code, is  
 15 amended—

16 (A) in subsection (b)(4), by striking “subsection  
 17 (i)” and inserting “subsection (h)”; and

18 (B) in subsection (g)(3), by striking “subsection  
 19 (i)” and inserting “subsection (h)”.

20 (3) Section 724 of the Strom Thurmond National De-  
 21 fense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 1999 (Public Law  
 22 105–261; 112 Stat. 2069) is amended by striking “subjec-  
 23 tion (j)” and inserting “subsection (i)”.

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
