# A BILL

To improve the Federal capability to deal with child exploitation.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protection of Children
- 5 From On-Line Predators and Exploitation Act of 1999".

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3 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is 4 authorized to be appropriated to the Customs Service 5 \$10,000,000 for fiscal year 2000 to carry out the Child 6 Pornography/Child Sexual Exploitation Program estab-7 lished by the Child Cybersmuggling Center of the Customs 8 Service.

9 (b) USE OF AMOUNTS FOR CHILD PORNOGRAPHY 10 CYBER TIPLINE.—Of the amount appropriated under sub-11 section (a), the Customs Service shall provide 3.75 percent 12 of such amount to the National Center for Missing and 13 Exploited Children for the operation of the child pornog-14 raphy cyber tipline of the Center and for increased public 15 awareness of the tipline.

### 16 SEC. 3. WIRETAPPING AUTHORITY.

Section 2516(1)(c) of title 18, United States Code,
is amended by inserting "section 2423(b) (relating to travel with intent to engage in sexual acts with juveniles),"
before "section 1203".

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
