A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit interstateconnected conduct relating to exotic animals.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Captive Exotic Animal3 Protection Act of 1999".

4 SEC. 2. TRANSPORT OR POSSESSION OF EXOTIC ANIMALS
5 FOR PURPOSES OF KILLING OR INJURING
6 THEM.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 3 of title 18, United
8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol9 lowing:

10 "§ 48. Exotic animals

11 "(a) Whoever, in or affecting interstate or foreign 12 commerce, knowingly transfers, transports, or possesses a 13 confined exotic animal, for the purposes of allowing the 14 killing or injuring of that animal for entertainment or the 15 collection of a trophy, shall be fined under this title or 16 imprisoned not more than one year, or both.

17 "(b) As used in this section—

18 "(1) the term 'confined exotic animal' means a
19 mammal of a species not historically indigenous to
20 the United States that in fact has been held in cap21 tivity for the shorter of—

- 22 "(A) the greater part of the animal's life;
 23 or
- 24 "(B) a period of one year;
- 25 whether or not the defendant knew the length of the
- 26 captivity; and

"(2) the term 'captivity' does not include any 1 2 period during which the animal— "(A) lives as it would in the wild, surviving 3 primarily by foraging for naturally occurring 4 food, roaming at will over an open area of at 5 least 1,000 acres; and 6 "(B) has the opportunity to avoid hunt-7 ers.". 8 9 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections at the end of chapter 3 of title 18, United States Code, 10 is amended by adding at the end the following new item: 11 "48. Exotic animals.".
