A BILL

To provide that no Federal income tax shall be imposed on amounts received by Holocaust victims or their heirs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NO FEDERAL INCOME TAX ON AMOUNTS RE-
- 4 CEIVED BY HOLOCAUST VICTIMS OR THEIR
- 5 HEIRS.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of the Internal Rev-
- 7 enue Code of 1986, gross income shall not include any
- 8 amount received by an individual (or any heir of the indi-
- 9 vidual) from any person as a result of any moral or legal

- 1 injustice experienced by such individual as a Holocaust
- 2 victim.
- 3 (b) Holocaust Victim.—For purposes of this sec-
- 4 tion, the term "Holocaust victim" means any individual
- 5 who was persecuted for racial or religious reasons by Nazi
- 6 Germany or any other Axis regime as a result of the Holo-
- 7 caust.
- 8 (c) Effective Date.—This section shall apply to
- 9 any amount received before, on, or after the date of the
- 10 enactment of this Act.

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
