7	(a) In General.—Section 407(d) of the Social Secu-
8	rity Act (42 U.S.C. 607(d)) is amended by striking para-
9	graphs (10) and (11) and inserting the following:
10	"(10)(A) in the case of an individual who has
11	not completed secondary school or received a certifi-
12	cate of general equivalence, satisfactory attendance
13	at such a school or in a course of study leading to
14	such a certificate, but only if the individual is mak-
15	ing satisfactory progress towards graduation or re-
16	ceipt of the certificate, as the case may be; or
17	"(B) in the case of any individual, satisfactory
18	attendance at an institution of higher education (as
19	defined in section 1201(a) of the Higher Education
20	Act of 1965), but only if the individual is making
21	satisfactory progress towards completing a course of
22	study offered by the institution; and".
23	(b) Conforming Amendments.—
24	(1) Section 407(d) of such Act (42 U.S.C.
25	607(d)) is amended by redesignating paragraph (12)
26	as paragraph (11).

1	(2) Section 407(c) of such Act (42 U.S.C.
2	607(c)) is amended—
3	(A) in paragraph (1), by striking "(12)"
4	each place such term appears and inserting
5	"(11)"; and
6	(B) in paragraph (2), by striking subpara-
7	graphs (C) and (D).
