- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Judges for
- 5 Florida Act of 1999".

1	SEC. 2. DISTRICT JUDGES FOR THE FLORIDA DISTRICT
2	COURTS.
3	(a) In General.—The President shall appoint, by
4	and with the advice and consent of the Senate—
5	(1) 5 additional district judges for the middle
6	district of Florida; and
7	(2) 2 additional district judges for the southern
8	district of Florida.
9	(b) Tables.—In order that the table contained in
10	section 133 of title 28, United States Code, will reflect
11	the changes in the total number of permanent district
12	judgeships authorized as a result of subsection (a) of this
13	section, the item relating to Florida in such table is
14	amended to read as follows:
	"Florida: 4 Northern 4 Middle 16 Southern 18.".
15	SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
16	There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
17	as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this
18	Act, including such sums as may be necessary to provide
19	appropriate space and facilities for the judicial positions
20	created by this Act.

1 SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.
