Mr. STUPAK introduced the following bill; which was referred to the

A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to restrict the mail-
order sale of body armor.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Body Armor Restric-
5 tion Act of 1999”.

6 **SEC. 2. UNLAWFUL MAIL-ORDER SALE OF BODY ARMOR.**

7 Title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding
8 at the end the following new chapter:

1 **“CHAPTER 44A—BODY ARMOR**

“941. Unlawful acts.”.

2 **“§ 941. Unlawful acts**

3 “(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this sec-
4 tion, it shall be unlawful for a person to sell or deliver
5 body armor unless the transferee meets in person with the
6 transferor to accomplish the sale, delivery, and receipt of
7 the matter.

8 “(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to body armor
9 used by law enforcement officers.

10 “(c) As used in this section—

11 “(1) the term ‘body armor’ means any product
12 sold or offered for sale as personal protective body
13 covering whether the product is to be worn alone or
14 is sold as a complement to other products or gar-
15 ments; and

16 “(2) the term ‘law enforcement officer’ means
17 any officer, agent, or employee of the United States,
18 a State, or a political subdivision of a State, author-
19 ized by law or by a government agency to engage in
20 or supervise the prevention, detection, investigation,
21 or prosecution of any violation of criminal law.”.

1 “(d) Whoever knowingly violates this section shall be
2 fined under this title or imprisoned not more than two
3 years, or both.”.
