## A BILL

To provide for the coordinated end-to-end testing and disclosure of the readiness of certain Federal and non-Federal computer systems for the year 2000 computer problem.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Y2K Test
- 5 Day Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. NATIONAL TEST DAY.
- 7 All Federal agencies that have responsibilities with
- 8 respect to health, safety, payments to individuals, delivery

- 1 of services to consumers, and national defense issues shall
- 2 participate, and all State, local, or private agencies or or-
- 3 ganizations having responsibilities with respect to those
- 4 issues shall be encouraged to participate, in a National
- 5 Y2K Test Day on July 1, 1999, to test the readiness of
- 6 mission critical computer systems in those areas for Janu-
- 7 ary 1, 2000, and to provide advance notice of problems
- 8 that may occur on such day with such computer systems,
- 9 with the interoperation of such computer systems, or both.

#### 10 SEC. 3. NATIONAL DISCLOSURE DAY.

- 11 All Federal agencies that have responsibilities with
- 12 respect to health, safety, payments to individuals, delivery
- 13 of services to consumers, and national defense issues shall
- 14 participate, and all State, local, or private agencies or or-
- 15 ganizations having responsibilities with respect to those
- 16 issues shall be encouraged to participate, in a National
- 17 Y2K Disclosure Day on August 16, 1999, to disclose the
- 18 readiness of mission critical computer systems in those
- 19 areas for January 1, 2000, and to disclose advance notice
- 20 of problems that may occur on such day with such com-
- 21 puter systems, with the interoperation of such computer
- 22 systems, or both.
