Mr. Hall of Texas introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

## A BILL

To authorize the President to consent to third party transfer of the ex-USS Bowman County to the USS LST Ship Memorial, Inc.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY TO CONSENT TO THIRD PARTY

TRANSFER OF EX-USS BOWMAN COUNTY TO

USS LST SHIP MEMORIAL, INC.

(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following findings:

(1) It is the long-standing policy of the United

States Government to deny requests for the retrans-

- fer of significant military equipment that originated in the United States to private entities.
- 3 (2) In very exceptional circumstances, when the 4 United States public interest would be served by the 5 proposed retransfer and end-use, such requests may 6 be favorably considered.
  - (3) Such retransfers to private entities have been authorized in very exceptional circumstances following appropriate demilitarization and receipt of assurances from the private entity that the item to be transferred would be used solely in furtherance of Federal Government contracts or for static museum display.
    - (4) Nothing in this section should be construed as a revision of long-standing policy referred to in paragraph (1).
  - (5) The Government of Greece has requested the consent of the United States Government to the retransfer of HS Rodos (ex-USS Bowman County (LST 391)) to the USS LST Ship Memorial, Inc.
- 21 (b) AUTHORITY TO CONSENT TO RETRANSFER.—
- 22 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (2), 23 the President may consent to the retransfer by the 24 Government of Greece of HS Rodos (ex-USS Bow-
