- 5 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
- 6 "Federal Employee Flexibility Act of 1999".
- 7 (b) IN GENERAL.—Section 7905 of title 5, United
- 8 States Code, is amended—
- 9 (1) in subsection (a)—

3	(B) in paragraph (3) by striking "; and"
4	and inserting a period; and
5	(C) by striking paragraph (4); and
6	(2) in subsection $(b)(2)$ —
7	(A) by amending subparagraph (A) to read
8	as follows:
9	"(A) a qualified transportation fringe as de-
10	fined in section 132(f)(1) of the Internal Revenue
11	Code of 1986;";
12	(B) in subparagraph (B) by striking "and"
13	after the semicolon;
14	(C) in subparagraph (C) by striking the
15	period and inserting "; and; and
16	(D) by adding at the end the following:
17	"(D) taxable cash payment to an employee in
18	lieu of an agency-provided parking space.".
