13 (b) FLEET REPLACEMENT.—There are authorized to be tothe National Science Foundation 14 appropriated 15 \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 2000 and \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 2001, to remain available until expended, to meet the 16 17 marine research and related environmental research and 18 development data requirements of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration set forth in the "NOAA Fish-19 eries Data Acquisition Plan", dated September 1998, and 20 21 that could also help meet the Nation's marine research and 22 related environmental research and development needs. The 23 National Science Foundation, in consultation with the De-24 partment of the Navy, the University-National Oceanic Laboratory System, academia, the National Oceanic and 25

Atmospheric Administration, the private sector, and any 1 other parties it considers appropriate, shall develop a strat-2 3 equ for meeting such requirements and other Federal ma-4 rine research and related environmental research and devel-5 opment requirements, using funds appropriated under this subsection and at the lowest possible cost. The National 6 7 Science Foundation shall consider all options, including 8 various methods of acquiring vessel services, remote sensing, 9 and any other possible means.

10 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Director of the National 11 12 Science Foundation shall submit to the Committee on 13 Science of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate 14 15 a report detailing the strategy developed pursuant to subsection (b) and a plan for implementing such strategy. The 16 Director shall include in such report an analysis of the ex-17 tent to which funds authorized by subsection (b) will be suf-18 ficient to implement such strategy. 19

2 (a) SERVICE CONTRACTS.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law and subject to the availability of appro-3 priations, the Secretary shall enter into contracts, including 4 5 multiyear contracts, subject to subsection (c), for the use of vessels to conduct marine research and related environ-6 7 mental research and development activities, monitoring, en-8 forcement, and management, and to acquire other data nec-9 essary to carry out the missions of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The Secretary shall enter 10 into these contracts unless— 11

(1) the cost of the contract is more than the cost
(including the cost of vessel operation, maintenance,
and all personnel) to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration of obtaining those services
on vessels of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric
Administration;

18 (2) the contract is for more than 7 years; or

19 (3) the data are acquired through a vessel agree20 ment pursuant to subsection (d).

(b) VESSELS.—The Secretary may not enter into any
contract under this section for the construction, lease-purchase, upgrade, or service life extension of any vessel.

24 (c) MULTIYEAR CONTRACTS.—

25 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraphs (2) and
26 (3), and notwithstanding section 1341 of title 31,
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United States Code, and section 11 of title 41, United
 States Code, the Secretary may acquire data, includ ing marine research and related environmental re search and development data, under multiyear con tracts.

6 (2) REQUIRED FINDINGS.—The Secretary may 7 not enter into a contract pursuant to this subsection 8 unless the Secretary finds with respect to that con-9 tract that there is a reasonable expectation that 10 throughout the contemplated contract period the Sec-11 retary will request from Congress funding for the con-12 tract at the level required to avoid contract termination. 13

14 (3) REQUIRED PROVISIONS.—The Secretary may
15 not enter into a contract pursuant to this subsection
16 unless the contract includes—

17 (A) a provision under which the obligation
18 of the United States to make payments under the
19 contract for any fiscal year is subject to the
20 availability of appropriations provided in ad21 vance for those payments;

(B) a provision that specifies the term of effectiveness of the contract; and

24 (C) appropriate provisions under which, in
25 case of any termination of the contract before the

1	end of the term specified pursuant to subpara-
2	graph (B), the United States shall only be liable
3	for the lesser of—
4	(i) an amount specified in the contract
5	for such a termination; or
6	(ii) amounts that were appropriated
7	before the date of the termination for the
8	performance of the contract or for procure-
9	ment of the type of acquisition covered by
10	the contract and are unobligated on the date
11	of the termination.
12	(d) Vessel Agreements.—The Secretary shall use
13	excess capacity of University-National Oceanographic Lab-
14	oratory System vessels where appropriate and may enter
15	into memoranda of agreement with the operators of these
16	vessels to carry out this requirement.
17	SEC. 9. REPEAL.
18	The NOAA Fleet Modernization Act (33 U.S.C. 891
19	et seq.) is repealed.
20	SEC. 10. INTERNET AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION.

3 SEC. 11. ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARDS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator and the Director shall exclude from consideration for grant agreements 5 made after fiscal year 1999 by the National Oceanic and 6 7 Atmospheric Administration and the National Science 8 Foundation, under the activities for which funds are au-9 thorized by this Act, any person who received funds, other 10 than those described in subsection (b), appropriated for a fiscal year after fiscal year 1999, under a grant agreement 11 from any Federal funding source for a project that was not 12 13 subjected to a competitive, merit-based award process, except as specifically authorized by this Act. Any exclusion 14 15 from consideration pursuant to this section shall be effective 16 for a period of 5 years after the person receives such Federal 17 funds.

(b) EXCEPTION.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to the
receipt of Federal funds by a person due to the membership
of that person in a class specified by law for which assistance is awarded to members of the class according to a formula provided by law.

(c) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this section, the
term "grant agreement" means a legal instrument whose
principal purpose is to transfer a thing of value to the re-

1 cipient to carry out a public purpose of support or stimulation authorized by a law of the United States, and does 2 not include the acquisition (by purchase, lease, or barter) 3 4 of property or services for the direct benefit or use of the United States Government. Such term does not include a 5 cooperative agreement (as such term is used in section 6305 6 7 of title 31. (c) ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE.—Of the
amounts authorized under subsection (a),
