A BILL

To prohibit the sale of guns that have not been approved by the Secretary of the Treasury, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Save a Child Act of
- 5 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITIONS WITH RESPECT TO UNAPPROVED
- 7 GUNS.
- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 9 sion of law, it shall be unlawful, with such exceptions for

- 1 law enforcement and other legitimate purposes as the Sec-
- 2 retary of the Treasury by rule provides, to sell, purchase,
- 3 or possess any firearm (as defined in section 921 of title
- 4 18, United States Code) that is not approved by the Sec-
- 5 retary. The Secretary shall not approve for the purposes
- 6 of this section the Intratec TEC-9 and similar weapons.
- 7 (b) Penalty.—Whoever possesses a firearm in viola-
- 8 tion of subsection (a) shall be fined under title 18, United
- 9 States Code, or imprisoned for 5 years, or both.
- 10 (c) Effective Date.—This section shall take effect
- 11 30 days after the date the Secretary first makes rules
- 12 under subsection (a).
