A BILL

To restrict the sale of cigarettes in packages of less than 15 cigarettes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Anti 'Kiddie-Pack'
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. SMALL PACKAGES.
- 7 Cigarettes may not be offered for sale in packages
- 8 which—
- 9 (1) contain less than 15 cigarettes; and

- 1 (2) are offered for sale to the consumer at less
- 2 than \$2.
- 3 SEC. 3. ENFORCEMENT.
- 4 A violation of section 2 shall be considered a violation
- 5 of section 301 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic
- 6 Act (21 U.S.C. 331).
- 7 SEC. 4. PREEMPTION.
- 8 This Act shall not be construed as affecting the au-
- 9 thority of the Food and Drug Administration with respect
- 10 to tobacco products.
- 11 SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- This Act shall take effect upon the expiration of 180
- 13 days after the date of its enactment.
