## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of including the Gaviota Coast of California in the National Park System.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Gaviota Coast Act of
- 5 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. GAVIOTA COAST.
- 7 (a) Study Requirement.—The Secretary of the In-
- 8 terior shall conduct a study, pursuant to the criteria set
- 9 forth in section 8(c)(2) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C.
- 10 1a-5(c)(2); commonly known as the National Park Sys-

- 1 tem General Authorities Act), of the suitability and feasi-
- 2 bility of including the area of California known as the
- 3 Gaviota Coast in the National Park System. The study
- 4 area shall extend generally from Coal Oil Point at Santa
- 5 Barbara to Point Sal, California.
- 6 (b) Submission.—The Secretary shall submit the
- 7 findings of such study upon its completion to the Com-
- 8 mittee on Resources of the House of Representatives and
- 9 the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the
- 10 Senate.
