## A BILL

To increase discretionary funding for certain grant programs established under the “Edward Byrne Memorial State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Programs”.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. INCREASE DISCRETIONARY FUNDING FOR CER-**  
 2 **TAIN GRANT PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED**  
 3 **UNDER THE “EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL**  
 4 **STATE AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AS-**  
 5 **SISTANCE PROGRAMS”.**

6 Section 1001(a) of the Omnibus Crime Control and  
 7 Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3793(a)) is amended  
 8 by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

9 “(24) There is authorized to be appropriated  
 10 \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 1999 to carry out sub-  
 11 part 2 of part E of this title.”.

12 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

13 Section 1001(a)(3) is amended by adding at the end  
 14 the following sentence: “There are authorized to be appro-  
 15 priated \$50,000,000 for fiscal year 1999 to carry out the  
 16 remaining functions of the Office of Justice Programs and  
 17 the Bureau of Justice Assistance other than functions  
 18 under parts D, E, F, G, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U,  
 19 V, W, and X.”.
