To amend title 5, United States Code, to increase the mandatory retirement age for law enforcement officers from 57 to 60 years of age.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. INCREASE IN MANDATORY RETIREMENT AGE.
- 4 (a) Civil Service Retirement System.—
- 5 (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 8335(b) of title 5,
- 6 United States Code, is amended by inserting after
- 7 the second sentence the following: "A law enforce-
- 8 ment officer who is otherwise eligible for immediate
- 9 retirement under section 8336(c) shall be separated
- from the service on the last day of the month in

1	which such officer becomes 60 years of age or com-
2	pletes 20 years of service if then over that age.".
3	(2) Conforming Amendments.—Section
4	8335(b) of such title 5, as amended by paragraph
5	(1), is further amended—
6	(A) in the second sentence—
7	(i) by striking "law enforcement offi-
8	cer or"; and
9	(ii) by striking "officer or courier, as
10	the case may be," and inserting "courier";
11	and
12	(B) in the sentence following the sentence
13	added by paragraph (1) by striking "age." and
14	inserting "age, or, in the case of a law enforce-
15	ment officer, until that employee becomes 63
16	years of age.".
17	(b) Federal Employees' Retirement System.—
18	(1) In general.—Section 8425(b) of title 5,
19	United States Code, is amended by inserting after
20	the second sentence the following: "A law enforce-
21	ment officer who is otherwise eligible for immediate
22	retirement under section 8412(d) shall be separated
23	from the service on the last day of the month in
24	which such officer becomes 60 years of age or com-
25	pletes 20 years of service if then over that age.".

1	(2) Conforming amendments.—Section
2	8412(b) of such title 5, as amended by paragraph
3	(1), is further amended—
4	(A) in the second sentence by striking "law
5	enforcement officer or" each place it appears;
6	and
7	(B) in the sentence following the sentence
8	added by paragraph (1) by striking "age." and
9	inserting "age, or, in the case of a law enforce-
10	ment officer, until that employee becomes 63
11	years of age.".
