A BILL

To prohibit the importation of dangerous firearms that have been modified to avoid the ban on semiautomatic assault weapons.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Assault Weapon Ban
- 5 Enhancement Act of 1999".

1	SEC. 2. BAN ON IMPORTATION OF DANGEROUS FIREARMS
2	THAT HAVE BEEN MODIFIED TO AVOID THE
3	BAN ON SEMIAUTOMATIC ASSAULT WEAP
4	ONS.
5	Section 925 of title 18, United States Code, is
6	amended by adding at the end the following:
7	"(g) The Secretary shall prohibit the importation or
8	bringing into the United States of any semiautomatic as-
9	sault weapon (including the frame or receiver of any such
10	weapon) that is of a type which, as of May 1, 1998, was
11	determined under subsection (d)(3) to be not generally
12	recognized as particularly suitable for or readily adaptable
13	to sporting purposes, or that includes any of the following
14	characteristics:
15	"(1) The weapon has a thumb hole stock that
16	functions as a pistol grip.
17	"(2) The weapon can accept a detachable large
18	capacity ammunition magazine.
19	"(3) The weapon has a fixed magazine which
20	can be readily modified to accept a large capacity
21	ammunition magazine.
22	"(4) The weapon uses .22 caliber ammuni-
23	tion.".
