A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Army to designate Fort Belvoir, Virginia, as the site for the planned National Museum of the United States Army.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Museum of
- 5 the United States Army Site Act of 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.
- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
- 8 ings:

- 1 (1) The Nation does not have adequate knowl-2 edge of the role of the United States Army in the 3 development and protection of the United States.
 - (2) The United States Army, which is the oldest United States military service, lacks a primary museum with public exhibition space and is in dirent need of a permanent facility to house and display its historical artifacts.
 - (3) Such a museum would serve to enhance the preservation, study, and interpretation of Army historical artifacts.
 - (4) Many Army artifacts of historical significance and national interest, which are currently unavailable for public display, would be exhibited in such a museum.
 - (5) While the Smithsonian Institution would be able to assist the Army in developing programs of presentations relating to the mission, values, and heritage of the Army, such a museum would be a more appropriate institution for such programs.
 - (b) Purposes.—The purposes of this Act are—
 - (1) to designate a permanent site for a museum to serve as the National Museum of the United States Army;

2	and interpretation of the artifacts and history col-
3	lected by such museum;
4	(3) to enhance the knowledge of the American
5	people to the role of the Army in United States his-
6	tory; and
7	(4) to provide a facility for the public display of
8	the artifacts and history of the Army.
9	SEC. 3. LOCATION OF NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE UNITED
10	STATES ARMY.
11	The Secretary of the Army shall designate Fort
12	Belvoir, Virginia, as the location of the National Museum
