# AN ACT

To provide grants to the States to improve the reporting of unidentified and missing persons.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as "Jennifer's Law".

#### 1 SEC. 2. PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.

- 2 The Attorney General is authorized to provide grant
- 3 awards to States to enable States to improve the reporting
- 4 of unidentified and missing persons.

## 5 SEC. 3. ELIGIBILITY.

- 6 (a) APPLICATION.—To be eligible to receive a grant
- 7 award under this Act, a State shall submit an application
- 8 at such time and in such form as the Attorney General
- 9 may reasonably require.
- 10 (b) CONTENTS.—Each such application shall include
- 11 assurances that the State shall, to the greatest extent
- 12 possible—
- 13 (1) report to the National Crime Information
- 14 Center and when possible, to law enforcement au-
- thorities throughout the State regarding every de-
- 16 ceased unidentified person, regardless of age, found
- in the State's jurisdiction;
- 18 (2) enter a complete profile of such unidentified
- person in compliance with the guidelines established
- 20 by the Department of Justice for the National
- 21 Crime Information Center Missing and Unidentified
- Persons File, including dental records, x-rays, and
- 23 fingerprints, if available;
- 24 (3) enter the National Crime Information Cen-
- 25 ter number or other appropriate number assigned to

- 1 the unidentified person on the death certificate of
- 2 each such unidentified person; and
- 3 (4) retain all such records pertaining to uniden-
- 4 tified persons until a person is identified.

#### 5 SEC. 4. USES OF FUNDS.

- 6 A State that receives a grant award under this Act
- 7 may use such funds received to establish or expand pro-
- 8 grams developed to improve the reporting of unidentified
- 9 persons in accordance with the assurances provided in the
- 10 application submitted pursuant to section 3(b).

## 11 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out
- 13 this Act \$2,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2000, 2001,
- 14 and 2002.
