A BILL

To require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to conduct a study on mortality and adverse outcome rates of Medicare patients of providers of anesthesia services, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Anesthesia Outcomes
5 Study Act of 1999”.

1 **SEC. 2. ANESTHESIA OUTCOME STUDY.**

2 (a) STUDY.—(1) The Secretary of Health and
3 Human Services shall conduct a study of mortality and
4 adverse outcome rates of Medicare patients by providers
5 of anesthesia services. In conducting the study, the Sec-
6 retary shall analyze the impact of physician supervision
7 of providers of anesthesia services, or lack thereof, on such
8 mortality and adverse outcome rates.

9 (2) In conducting the study, the Secretary shall con-
10 sult with appropriate national professional organizations
11 with respect to the methodology of the study, and shall
12 use Medicare operating room anesthesia data, adjusted for
13 patient acuity and other relevant scientific variables.

14 (b) REPORT.—Not later than June 30, 2000, the
15 Secretary shall submit to Congress a report containing the
16 results of the study conducted under subsection (a).

17 (c) CONSIDERATION OF REPORT IN RULEMAKING.—
18 The Secretary shall consider the results of such study
19 when determining if any modification or change to the ex-
20 isting Medicare regulations in effect on January 1, 1999,
21 dealing with physician supervision of anesthesia services
22 may be appropriate.

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
