## A BILL

To provide for the establishment of a National Firearm Injury Reporting System, and for grants to States for the collection of information on fatal injuries caused by firearms.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL FIREARM INJURY REPORTING SYSTEM; GRANTS TO
- 5 STATES FOR THE COLLECTION OF INFORMA-
- 6 TION ON FATAL FIREARMS INJURIES.
- 7 (a) Establishment of National Firearm Injury
- 8 Reporting System.—The Secretary of Health and

- 1 Human Services (in this section referred to as the "Sec-
- 2 retary'') shall establish a National Firearm Injury Report-
- 3 ing System, consisting of a central repository of informa-
- 4 tion on all fatal injuries caused by firearms in the United
- 5 States.
- 6 (b) Grants to States.—The Secretary may make
- 7 grants to States to enable each State to collect information
- 8 on all fatal injuries caused by firearms in the State, in-
- 9 cluding any such information collected by other sources
- 10 of such information.
- 11 (c) REGULATIONS.—The Secretary, in consultation
- 12 with State and local officials, shall prescribe such regula-
- 13 tions as may be necessary to carry out this section, includ-
- 14 ing regulations specifying the specific kinds of information
- 15 to be collected pursuant to this section, and the procedures
- 16 to be followed in collecting such information and reporting
- 17 such information to the National Firearm Injury Report-
- 18 ing System.
- 19 (d) Advisory Committee.—The Secretary shall es-
- 20 tablish an advisory committee, composed of such members
- 21 as the Secretary may select, for the purpose of providing
- 22 the Secretary with advice on the appropriate standards to
- 23 apply in the awarding of grants under this section.
- 24 (e) Limitations on Authorization of Appro-
- 25 PRIATIONS.—To carry out this section, there are author-

- 1 ized to be appropriated to the Attorney General not more
- $2\,$  than \$6,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2000 through

3 2004.
