## A BILL

To establish a Medicare administrative fee for submission of paper claims.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Medicare Paperless
- 5 Claims Promotion Act of 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF MEDICARE ADMINISTRATIVE
- 7 FEE FOR SUBMISSION OF PAPER CLAIMS.
- 8 (a) Imposition of Fee.—Notwithstanding any
- 9 other provision of law, the Secretary of Health and

- 1 Human Services shall establish (in the form of a separate
- 2 fee or reduction of payment otherwise made under the
- 3 medicare program under title XVIII of the Social Security
- 4 Act) an administrative fee of \$1 for the submission of a
- 5 claim in a paper or non-electronic form for items or serv-
- 6 ices for which payment is sought under such title.
- 7 (b) Exception Authority.—The Secretary—
- 8 (1) shall waive the imposition of a fee under
- 9 subsection (a) in cases in which there is no method
- available for the submission of claims other than in
- a written form; and
- 12 (2) may waive the imposition of such a fee in
- such unusual cases as the Secretary finds appro-
- priate.
- 15 (c) Effective Date.—Subsection (a) applies to
- 16 claims submitted on or after January 1, 2003.
- 17 (d) The Secretary shall make available at no charge,
- 18 public domain software to facilitate the filing of electronic
- 19 forms and claims under title XVIII and XIX of the Social
- 20 Security Act.
