## A BILL

To repeal the limitation on judicial jurisdiction imposed by section 377 of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

### 3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Legal Amnesty Res-  
5 toration Act of 1999”.

1 **SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF LIMITATION ON LEGALIZATION**  
2 **LITIGATION.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 245A(f)(4) of the Immi-  
4 gration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255a(f)(4)) is  
5 amended by striking subparagraph (C).

6 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by  
7 subsection (a) shall be effective as if included in the enact-  
8 ment of section 201 of the Immigration Reform and Con-  
9 trol Act of 1986 (Public Law 99–603; 100 Stat. 3394).
