## A BILL

To compensate certain former American hostages held in Lebanon and certain members of their families.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Former Hostage Com-
- 5 pensation Act of 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. STATEMENT OF POLICY.
- 7 It is the policy of the Congress that the Department
- 8 of State should make a full effort to assist former Amer-
- 9 ican hostages, taken as victims of international terrorism,

1	in matters of compensation for injuries related to their
2	imprisonment.
3	SEC. 3. COMPENSATION OF VICTIMS OF CERTAIN TER-
4	RORIST ACTS.
5	Subject to the availability appropriated funds, and
6	subject to such conditions as the Secretary of State may
7	prescribe to prevent unjust enrichment, the Secretary shall
8	pay, to each plaintiff in the case of Cicippio v. Islamic
9	Republic of Iran (Civil Action No. 96–1805(TPJ),
10	brought in the United States District Court for the Dis-
11	trict of Columbia) who requests such payment, the fol-
12	lowing amounts:
13	(1) To a former hostage, a sum not to exceed
