A BILL

To provide for the establishment of a national cemetery on a portion of Fort Gordon, Georgia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. LAND TRANSFER FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL CEMETERY, FORT GORDON, GEORGIA.

(a) TRANSFER OF LAND FOR NATIONAL CEMETERY.—The Secretary of the Army may transfer, without
reimbursement, to the administrative jurisdiction of the

Secretary of Veterans Affairs a parcel of real property,

- 1 including any improvements thereon, at Fort Gordon,
- 2 Georgia, for the purpose of permitting the Secretary of
- 3 Veterans Affairs to establish a national cemetery on the
- 4 parcel.
- 5 (b) Use of Property.—The Secretary of Veterans
- 6 Affairs shall use the real property transferred under sub-
- 7 section (a) as a national cemetery under chapter 24 of
- 8 title 38, United States Code.
- 9 (c) Return of Unused Portion.—If the Secretary
- 10 of Veterans Affairs determines that any portion of the real
- 11 property transferred under subsection (a) is not needed
- 12 for use as a national cemetery, the Secretary of Veterans
- 13 Affairs shall return such portion to the administrative ju-
- 14 risdiction of the Secretary of the Army.
- 15 (d) Legal Description.—The exact acreage and
- 16 legal description of the real property to be transferred
- 17 under this section shall be determined by a survey satis-
- 18 factory to the Secretary of the Army. The cost of the sur-
- 19 vey shall be borne by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.
- 20 (e) Additional Terms and Conditions.—The
- 21 Secretary of the Army may require such additional terms
- 22 and conditions in connection with the transfer under this
- 23 section as the Secretary of the Army considers appropriate
- 24 to protect the interests of the United States.
