- 6 amended by striking "or" at the end of subparagraph (A),
- 7 by striking the period at the end of subparagraph (B) and

1	inserting "; or", and by adding after subparagraph (B)
2	the following:
3	"(C) the Attorney General, upon completion of
4	a preliminary examination under this chapter, deter-
5	mines that there are reasonable grounds to believe
6	that—
7	"(i) employees of the Department of Jus-
8	tice have engaged in misconduct, criminal activ-
9	ity, corruption, or fraud, and
10	"(ii) further investigation is warranted.".
