A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to increase certain payment amounts made to hospitals furnishing services under the Medicare Program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medicare HEAL (Hos-
5 pital Emergency Assistance Legislation) Act of 1999”.

6 **SEC. 2. INCREASE IN CERTAIN MEDICARE HOSPITAL PAY-**
7 **MENT AMOUNTS.**

8 (a) PAYMENTS FOR PPS HOSPITALS.—Section
9 1886(b)(3)(B)(i) of such Act (42 U.S.C.
10 1395ww(b)(3)(B)(i)) is amended—

1 (1) by striking subclauses (XV) and (XVI);

2 (2) by redesignating subclause (XVII) as sub-
3 clause (XVI);

4 (3) by inserting after subclause (XIV) the fol-
5 lowing new subclause:

6 “(XV) for each of fiscal years 2000 through
7 2002, the market basket percentage increase minus
8 1.0 percentage point for hospitals in all areas, and”.

9 (b) INDIRECT MEDICAL EDUCATION.—Section
10 188(d)(5)(B)(ii) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
11 1395ww(d)(5)(B)(ii)) is amended—

12 by striking subclauses (III), (IV), and (V) and
13 inserting the following new subclause:

14 “(III) on or after October 1, 1998, ‘c’ is
15 equal to 1.6.”.

16 (c) PAYMENTS FOR DISPROPORTIONATE SHARE AD-
17 JUSTMENTS.—Section 1886(d)(5)(F)(ix) of such Act (42
18 U.S.C. 1395ww(d)(5)(F)(ix)) is amended—

19 (1) by adding “and” at the end of subclause
20 (II); and

21 (2) by striking subclauses (III), (IV), (V), and
22 (VI) and inserting the following new subclause:

1 “(III) during fiscal year 2000 and each subse-
2 quent fiscal year, such additional payment amount
3 shall be reduced by 0 percent.”.
