A BILL

To require the National Park Service to conduct a feasibility study regarding options for the protection and expanded visitor enjoyment of nationally significant natural and cultural resources at Fort Hunter Liggett, California.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FEASIBILITY STUDY REGARDING PROTECTION
- 4 OF NATURAL AND CULTURAL RESOURCES AT
- 5 FORT HUNTER LIGGETT, CALIFORNIA.
- 6 (a) STUDY REQUIRED.—The Secretary of the Inte-
- 7 rior, acting through the Director of the National Park
- 8 Service, shall undertake a feasibility study regarding op-

- 1 tions for the near- and long-term protection and expanded
- 2 visitor enjoyment of nationally significant natural and cul-
- 3 tural resources by the National Park Service or other
- 4 agencies as appropriate at Fort Hunter Liggett, Cali-
- 5 fornia.
- 6 (b) Consultation.—The Secretary of the Interior
- 7 shall consult with all other affected or interested agencies,
- 8 including the Department of the Army, in the preparation
- 9 of the study.
- 10 (c) Completion and Submission.—Not later than
- 11 August 30, 2000, the Secretary of the Interior shall sub-
- 12 mit to Congress a report containing the results of the
- 13 study, along with such protection and visitor access rec-
- 14 ommendations as the Secretary of the Interior considers
- 15 appropriate.
