1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. ELIGIBILITY FOR NONPROFIT STANDARD MAIL 4 RATES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The American Battle Monuments
Commission and the World War II Memorial Advisory
Board (as referred to in Public Law 103–32 (40 U.S.C.
1003 note; 107 Stat. 90)) shall each be considered to qual9 ify for the rates of postage currently in effect under

former section 4452 of title 39, United States Code, for
 third-class mail matter mailed by a qualified nonprofit or ganization.

4 (b) RESTRICTION.—Rates of postage afforded by sub5 section (a) shall be available only with respect to official
6 mail sent for the furtherance of the purpose of section
7 2(c)(1) or 3 of Public Law 103–32, as applicable.
