Mr. TRAFICANT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform

A BILL

To require that the General Accounting Office study and report on possible connections between the recurring incidence of violence by postal employees and workplacerelated frustrations experienced by postal workers generally.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. STUDY AND REPORT.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The General Accounting Office
5 shall conduct a study to determine the extent to which
6 the incidence of seemingly random yet recurrent violence
7 on the part of employees and former employees of the

United States Postal Service might be related to the levels
 of workplace-related problems and frustrations experi enced by postal workers generally.

4 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—In conducting the study, the
5 General Accounting Office shall investigate—

6 (1) the number of formal or informal pro-7 ceedings brought by postal employees in recent years 8 in which supervisor abuse or other similar mistreat-9 ment by the Postal Service was alleged, and how 10 those proceedings were resolved;

(2) the degree of postal employee satisfaction or
dissatisfaction with the different procedures and
mechanisms available to them for having their workplace-related frustrations and complaints heard and
resolved, particularly any procedures or mechanisms
provided pursuant to collective bargaining; and

17 (3) the number of violent incidents committed
18 by employees or former employees of the Postal
19 Service in recent years, and whether workplace-re20 lated problems or frustrations may have been a con21 tributing factor.

(c) SPECIFIC MATTERS.—The matters to be investigated under subsection (b)(1) shall specifically include
discrimination on the basis of gender, race, or disability;
sexual harassment; retaliatory assignments; and irregular-

ities in hiring, training, promotions, and disciplinary ac tions.

3 (d) REPORT.—The General Accounting Office shall
4 transmit to the Congress and the United States Postal
5 Service, within 1 year after the date of enactment of this
6 Act, a report containing the findings and conclusions of
7 its study, together with recommendations for any legisla8 tion or administrative actions which it considers appro9 priate.

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
