A BILL

To require specific congressional authorization for the Secretary of the Interior to authorize construction of any visitor's center or museum in the proximity of or within the boundaries of Gettysburg National Military Park.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Gettysburg Preserva-
- 5 tion Act".

1	SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL AUTHORIZATION REQUIRED FOR
2	CERTAIN NEW CONSTRUCTION WITHIN GET-
3	TYSBURG NATIONAL MILITARY PARK.
4	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
5	sion of law, the Secretary of the Interior may not author-
6	ize the construction of any visitor's center or museum in
7	the proximity of or within the boundaries of Gettysburg
8	National Military Park, unless Congress has specifically
9	authorized the construction of such visitor's center or mu-
10	seum.
11	(b) Effective Date.—This Act shall be deemed to
12	have been enacted and taken effect on June 15, 1999.
