| 4  | The Congress finds that—                                     |
| 5  | (1) General Wesley Clark, North Atlantic Trea-               |

| 7  | mander, has valiantly directed United States and             |
| 8  | NATO forces in Operation Allied Force, culminating           |
| 9  | in the successful return to peace in the Balkans fol-        |

| 11 | slavia;  |
| 12 | (2) the United States and NATO forces under                  |
| 13 | the command of General Clark quickly degraded and            |
| 14 | damaged the Yugoslav military and security struc-            |
| 15 | ture that was used to depopulate and destroy the Al-         |
| 16 | banian majority in the Yugoslav Republic of Kosovo;          |
| 17 | (3) the United States and NATO forces under                  |
| 18 | the command of General Clark achieved the correct            |
| 19 | and justified objectives established by the President        |
| 20 | and the heads of State and governments of NATO               |

- 1 countries, while minimizing coalition casualties and 2 collateral civilian damage;
  - (4) the victory of United States and NATO forces provided for the immediate and safe return of all refugees and displaced persons of Kosovo, leading to greater stability and order in the Balkan region;
    - (5) the political sensitivities and detailed regional experience possessed by General Clark were fundamental to the success of Operation Allied Force and will lead to a lasting peace in accordance with United Nations Resolutions; and
    - (6) General Clark, together with his able staff and subordinate commanders, has led the members of the Armed Forces of the United States in an achievement of honor and victory remarkable in United States military history.

# 17 SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.

(a) Presentation Authorized.—The President is authorized to present, on behalf of the Congress, to General Wesley Clark a gold medal of appropriate design in recognition of his exemplary performance as a military leader in coordinating the planning, strategy, and execution of the United States and NATO combat action and his invaluable contributions to the United States and to the successful return to peace in the Balkans as Supreme

- 1 Allied Commander, Europe, and Commander-in-Chief,
- 2 United States European Command.
- 3 (b) Design and Striking.—For purposes of the
- 4 presentation referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary
- 5 of the Treasury (hereafter referred to in this Act as the
- 6 "Secretary") shall strike a gold medal with suitable em-
- 7 blems, devices, and inscriptions to be determined by the
- 8 Secretary.

### 9 SEC. 3. DUPLICATE MEDALS.

- The Secretary may strike bronze duplicates of the
- 11 gold medal struck pursuant to section 2, under such regu-
- 12 lations as the Secretary may prescribe, and may sell such
- 13 bronze duplicates at a price sufficient to cover the cost
- 14 thereof, including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery,
- 15 and overhead expenses, and the cost of the gold medal.

#### 16 SEC. 4. NATIONAL MEDALS.

- Medals struck pursuant to this Act are national med-
- 18 als for purposes of chapter 51 of title 31, United States
- 19 Code.

#### 20 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS; PROCEEDS

- 21 OF SALE.
- 22 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
- 23 authorized to be appropriated not to exceed \$30,000 to
- 24 carry out section 2.

- 1 (b) Proceeds of Sales.—Amounts received from
- 2 sales of duplicate bronze medals under section 3 shall be
- 3 credited to the appropriation made pursuant to the au-

4 thorization provided in subsection (a).
