A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief of Engineers and in coordination with other Federal agency heads, to participate in the funding and implementation of a balanced, long-term solution to the problems of groundwater contamination, water supply, and reliability affecting the Eastern Santa Clara groundwater basin in California, and for other purposes.

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Eastern Santa Clara
- 3 Basin Water Quality Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. EASTERN SANTA CLARA BASIN GROUNDWATER RES-
- 5 TORATION.
- 6 (a) Establishment of Restoration Fund.—
- 7 There shall be established in the Treasury of the United
- 8 States an interest bearing account to be known as the
- 9 Eastern Santa Clara Basin Restoration Fund (in this sec-
- 10 tion referred to as "Restoration Fund").
- 11 (b) Administration of Restoration Fund.—The
- 12 Restoration Fund shall be administered by the Secretary
- 13 of the Army (in this Act referred to as the "Secretary"),
- 14 acting through the Chief of Engineers. The Secretary shall
- 15 administer the Restoration Fund in cooperation with the
- 16 city of Santa Clarita, California, the California Depart-
- 17 ment of Toxic Substances Control, and the Castaic Lake
- 18 Water Agency (or the successors of such city, department,
- 19 or agency).
- 20 (c) Purposes of Restoration Fund.—The pro-
- 21 ceeds of the Restoration Fund shall be utilized by the Sec-
- 22 retary to design, construct, operate, and maintain water
- 23 quality projects that—
- 24 (1) are related to sites that are sources of per-
- 25 chlorates or any associated contaminants;
- 26 (2) are located in the city of Santa Clarita; and

(3) potentially affect the Eastern Santa Clara
groundwater basin.
(d) Authorization of Appropriations.—For
each of the fiscal years 2000 through 2004, there is au-
thorized to be appropriated to the Restoration Fund
\$5,000,000.
(e) Contributions From the State of Cali-
FORNIA.—The Secretary, acting through the Chief of En-
gineers, is authorized to accept and administer in coopera-
tion with the city of Santa Clarita, the California Depart-
ment of Toxic Substances Control, and the Castaic Lake
Water Agency (or the successors of such city, department
or agency) any funds which the State of California, local
government agencies, or private entities may contribute to
the Restoration Fund.
(f) Compliance With Applicable Law.—In car-
rying out the activities described in subsection (c), the
Secretary shall comply with all applicable Federal and
State laws.
(g) Relationship to Other Activities.—
(1) Authority to conduct other activi-
TIES.—Nothing in this Act shall be construed to
alter any other Federal or State authority being re-
lied upon to facilitate the cleanup and protection of

the Eastern Santa Clara groundwater basin.
