A BILL

To provide for the recognition of Jerusalem as the capital of Israel.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. UNITED STATES POLICY REGARDING JERU-
- 4 SALEM AS THE CAPITAL OF ISRAEL.
- 5 (a) Consulate in Jerusalem.—Notwithstanding
- 6 any other provision of law, the United States shall not
- 7 operate a United States consulate or diplomatic facility
- 8 in Jerusalem unless such consulate or diplomatic facility
- 9 is under the supervision of the United States Ambassador
- 10 to Israel.

- 1 (b) Identification of Jerusalem as the Cap-
- 2 ITAL OF ISRAEL IN OFFICIAL GOVERNMENT PUBLICA-
- 3 TIONS.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any
- 4 official government document which lists countries and
- 5 their capital cities shall identify Jerusalem as the capital
- 6 of Israel.
- 7 (c) Record of Place of Birth as Israel for
- 8 Passport Purposes.—For purposes of the registration
- 9 of birth, certification of nationality, or issuance of a pass-
- 10 port of a United States citizen born in the city of Jeru-
- 11 salem, the Secretary of State shall, upon the request of
- 12 the citizen, record the place of birth as Israel.
