Mrs. Meek of Florida introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a feasibility study on the inclusion in Biscayne National Park, Florida, of the archaeological site known as the Miami Circle.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. FEASIBILITY STUDY REGARDING INCLUSION 4 OF MIAMI CIRCLE IN BISCAYNE NATIONAL 5 PARK. (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following: 6 7 (1) The Tequesta Indians were one of the ear-8 liest groups to establish permanent villages in south-9 east Florida.

- 1 (2) The Tequestas had one of only two North 2 American civilizations that thrived and developed 3 into a complex social chiefdom without an agricul-4 tural base.
- 5 (3) The Tequesta sites that remain preserved6 today are rare.
 - (4) The Miami Circle, which includes the remains of a circular ceremonial site constructed by the Tequesta approximately 2,000 years ago, presents a valuable new opportunity to learn more about the Tequesta culture.
 - (5) Biscayne National Park in nearby Homestead, Florida, already contains and protects several prehistoric Tequesta sites.
 - (6) As a valuable archaeological resource and the only Tequesta ceremonial site of its kind known to exist in Florida, the Miami Circle is a national resource appropriate for preservation and protection as part of the National Park System.
- 20 (b) STUDY REQUIRED.—The Secretary of the Inte-21 rior, acting through the Director of the National Park 22 Service, shall conduct a study to determine the feasibility 23 of including the Miami Circle in Biscayne National Park
- 24 in the State of Florida.

- 1 (c) Components.—The study shall include the anal-
- 2 ysis and recommendations of the Secretary with respect
- 3 to—
- 4 (1) which, if any, particular areas of or sur-
- 5 rounding the Miami Circle should be included in
- 6 Biscayne National Park;
- 7 (2) whether any additional staff, facilities, or
- 8 other resources would be necessary to administer the
- 9 Miami Circle as a unit of the Park; and
- 10 (3) any impact on the local area that would re-
- sult from the inclusion of the Miami Circle in the
- 12 Park.
- 13 (d) Completion and Submission.—Not later than
- 14 19 months after the date of the enactment of this Act,
- 15 the Secretary shall submit to Congress a report describing
- 16 the findings and recommendations contained in the study.
- 17 (e) MIAMI CIRCLE DEFINED.—In this section, the
- 18 term "Miami Circle" means the property in Miami-Dade
- 19 County of the State of Florida consisting of the three par-
- 20 cels described in Exhibit A in the appendix to the sum-
- 21 mons to show cause and notice of eminent domain pro-
- 22 ceedings, filed February 18, 1999, in Miami-Dade County
- 23 v. Brickell Point, Ltd., in the circuit court of the 11th
- 24 judicial circuit of Florida in and for Miami-Dade County.

- 1 (f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 2 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-

3 essary to carry out this section.
