1	SECTION 1. TEMPORARY EXCEPTION FOR CERTAIN MIN-
2	NESOTA COUNTIES FROM THE LIMITATION
3	ON THE PERCENTAGE OF CROPLAND THAT
4	MAY BE ENROLLED IN THE CONSERVATION
5	RESERVE AND WETLANDS RESERVE PRO-
6	GRAMS.
7	Notwithstanding paragraphs (1) and (2) of section
8	1243(b) of the Food Security Act of 1985, the Secretary
9	of Agriculture shall exceed the limitations in paragraph
10	(1) of such section, in the case of each of the counties
11	of Roseau, Pennington, and Marshall, in the State of Min-
12	nesota, for the period of calendar years 1999 through
13	2002, if the county or area committee established for the
14	county under section $8(b)(5)$ of the Soil Conservation and
15	Domestic Allotment Act (16 U.S.C. 590h(b)(5)) determine
16	that such action would not adversely affect the local econ-
17	omy of the county.
