A BILL

To impose a one-year moratorium on promulgation of new
rules by the Health Care Financing Administration.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Halting HCFA Act
5 of 1999”.

6 **SEC. 2. ONE-YEAR MORATORIUM ON NEW HCFA RULES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator of the Health
8 Care Financing Administration (directly or through the
9 Secretary of Health and Human Services) shall not pro-

1 mulgate any rules or regulations that impose new require-
2 ments under the Social Security Act (other than require-
3 ments explicitly imposed under such Act, such as updates
4 and adjustments to annual payment amounts) during the
5 one-year period beginning on the date of the enactment
6 of this Act, unless the Secretary finds that they are needed
7 to preserve health and safety of individuals in the United
8 States (such as in the case of lifesaving emergencies).

9 (b) HEARINGS.—During such one-year period, such
10 Administrator shall gather the new rules or regulations
11 that the Administrator would like to promulgate and dur-
12 ing the first six months of that period hold public hearings
13 in all regions throughout the United States regarding such
14 rules and regulations and the costs and benefits of promul-
15 gating them.

16 (c) REPORT.—After conducting such public hearings,
17 in the seventh month of such one-year period, the Admin-
18 istrator shall submit to Congress a report regarding such
19 proposed rules and regulations, including the costs and
20 benefits associated with them. In promulgating any rules
21 and regulations after the end of such one-year period, the
22 Administrator shall consider any comments submitted by
23 the Congress in response to such report.

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
