A BILL

To impose a one-year moratorium on promulgation of new rules by the Health Care Financing Administration.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Halting HCFA Act
- 5 of 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. ONE-YEAR MORATORIUM ON NEW HCFA RULES.
- 7 (a) In General.—The Administrator of the Health
- 8 Care Financing Administration (directly or through the
- 9 Secretary of Health and Human Services) shall not pro-

- 1 mulgate any rules or regulations that impose new require-
- 2 ments under the Social Security Act (other than require-
- 3 ments explicitly imposed under such Act, such as updates
- 4 and adjustments to annual payment amounts) during the
- 5 one-year period beginning on the date of the enactment
- 6 of this Act, unless the Secretary finds that they are needed
- 7 to preserve health and safety of individuals in the United
- 8 States (such as in the case of lifesaving emergencies).
- 9 (b) Hearings.—During such one-year period, such
- 10 Administrator shall gather the new rules or regulations
- 11 that the Administrator would like to promulgate and dur-
- 12 ing the first six months of that period hold public hearings
- 13 in all regions throughout the United States regarding such
- 14 rules and regulations and the costs and benefits of promul-
- 15 gating them.
- 16 (c) Report.—After conducting such public hearings,
- 17 in the seventh month of such one-year period, the Admin-
- 18 istrator shall submit to Congress a report regarding such
- 19 proposed rules and regulations, including the costs and
- 20 benefits associated with them. In promulgating any rules
- 21 and regulations after the end of such one-year period, the
- 22 Administrator shall consider any comments submitted by
- 23 the Congress in response to such report.
