A BILL

 - eral department or agency involved negotiates an agreement with the entity that will conduct the research, the purpose of which negotiation is to provide, to the greatest extent practicable, that if pursuant to the research the medical treatment involved is determined to be safe and effective, the entity will, in accordance with the law of the sub-Saharan African country in which the research is conducted, make the treatment available to the individuals who participated as subjects in the research, and to other individuals in such country who have a medical need for the treatment, for a price that gives such individuals reasonable access to the treatment.
