AN ACT

- To present a congressional gold medal to astronauts Neil A. Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins, the crew of Apollo 11.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

- 2 The Congress finds the following:
- 3 (1) Astronaut Neil A. Armstrong, as com-4 mander of Apollo 11, achieved the historic accom-5 plishment of piloting the Lunar Module "Eagle" to
- 6 the surface of the Moon, and became the first person
- 7 to walk upon the Moon on July 20, 1969.
 - (2) Astronaut Buzz Aldrin joined Neil A. Armstrong in piloting the Lunar Module "Eagle" to the surface of the Moon, and became the second person to walk upon the Moon on July 20, 1969.
 - (3) Astronaut Michael Collins provided critical assistance to his fellow astronauts that landed on the Moon by piloting the Command Module "Columbia" in the Moon's orbit and communicating with Earth, thereby allowing his fellow Apollo 11 astronauts to successfully complete their mission on the surface of the Moon.
 - (4) By conquering the Moon at great personal risk to their safety, the three Apollo 11 astronauts advanced America scientifically and technologically, paving the way for future missions to other regions in space.
- 24 (5) The Apollo 11 astronauts, by and through 25 their historic feat, united the country in favor of 26 continued space exploration and research.

1 SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.

- 2 (a) Presentation Authorized.—The President is
- 3 authorized to present, on behalf of the Congress, gold
- 4 medals of appropriate design to astronauts Neil A. Arm-
- 5 strong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins, in recognition
- 6 of their monumental and unprecedented feat of space ex-
- 7 ploration, as well as their achievements in the advance-
- 8 ment of science and promotion of the space program.
- 9 (b) Design and Striking.—For the purpose of the
- 10 presentation referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary
- 11 of the Treasury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the
- 12 "Secretary") shall strike a gold medal with suitable em-
- 13 blems, devices, and inscriptions, to be determined by the
- 14 Secretary.

15 SEC. 3. DUPLICATE MEDALS.

- 16 Under such regulations as the Secretary may pre-
- 17 scribe, the Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in
- 18 bronze of the gold medal struck under section 2 at a price
- 19 sufficient to cover the costs of the medals, including labor,
- 20 materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead expenses.

21 SEC. 4. NATIONAL MEDALS.

- The medals struck under this Act are national medals
- 23 for purposes of chapter 51 of title 31, United States Code.

1 SEC. 5. PROCEEDS OF SALE.

- 2 Amounts received from the sale of duplicate bronze
- 3 medals under section 3 shall be deposited in the United
- 4 States Mint Public Enterprise Fund.
