To require an assessment of research on effects of radio frequency emissions on human health.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

3	SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.
4	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
5	ings:
6	(1) There has been a substantial effort by the
7	Federal Government to determine the effects of elec-
8	tric and magnetic fields on biological systems, as is
9	evidenced by the Electric and Magnetic Fields Re-

- 2 2118 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (Public Law
- 3 102–486; 42 U.S.C. 13478).
- 1 (2) This five-year program, which was coordi1 nated by the National Institute of Environmental
 2 Health Sciences and the Department of Energy, ex3 amined the possible effects of electric and magnetic
 4 fields on human health. Despite the success of this
 5 program, there has been no similar effort by the
 6 Federal Government to determine the possible effects on human health of radio frequency emissions

16 SEC. 2. ASSESSMENT OF RESEARCH ON EFFECTS OF RADIO

17 FREQUENCY EMISSIONS ON HUMAN HEALTH.

- 18 (a) Assessment.—The Secretary of Health and
- 19 Human Services shall carry out an independent assess-
- 20 ment on the effects of radio frequency emission on human
- 21 health. The Secretary shall carry out the independent as-
- 22 sessment through grants to appropriate public and private
- 23 entities selected by the Secretary for purposes of the inde-
- 24 pendent assessment.

- 1 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 2 are hereby authorized to be appropriated for the Secretary
- 3 of Health and Human Services for fiscal year 2000,
- 4 \$10,000,000 for purposes of grants for the independent
- 5 assessment required by subsection (a). Amounts appro-
- 6 priated pursuant to the authorization of appropriation in
- 7 the preceding sentence shall remain available until ex-
- 8 pended.
- 9 (c) The Secretary of Health and Human Services
- 10 shall produce a report on existing research evaluating the
- 11 biological effects to human health of short term, high-level,
- 12 as well as long-term, low-level exposures to radio frequency
- 13 emissions to Congress no later than January 1, 2001.
