Mr. THOMPSON of California introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To confer citizenship posthumously on Jose J. Casillas.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. POSTHUMOUS CITIZENSHIP FOR JOSE J.**
4 **CASILLAS.**

5 (a) GRANTING OF POSTHUMOUS CITIZENSHIP.—The
6 Attorney General shall provide, in accordance with this
7 section, for the granting of posthumous citizenship at the
8 time of death to Jose J. Casillas upon the approval of an
9 application for that posthumous citizenship under sub-
10 section (b).

11 (b) REQUEST FOR POSTHUMOUS CITIZENSHIP.—A
12 request for the granting of posthumous citizenship to Jose

1 J. Casillas may be filed on his behalf only by the next-
2 of-kin (as defined by the Attorney General) or another
3 representative (as defined by the Attorney General). The
4 Attorney General shall approve such a request if it is filed
5 not later than 2 years after the date of the enactment of
6 this section.

7 (c) DOCUMENTATION OF POSTHUMOUS CITIZEN-
8 SHIP.—If the Attorney General approves the request
9 under subsection (b), the Attorney General shall send to
10 the individual who filed the request a suitable document
11 which states that the United States considers Jose J.
12 Casillas to have been a citizen of the United States at the
13 time of his death.
