"(B) In no event shall the percentage adjustment tak ing effect under subparagraph (A) in any calendar year
 (before rounding), in any rate of pay, exceed the lesser
 of—

5 "(i) the percentage adjustment taking effect in
6 such calendar year under section 5303 of title 5,
7 United States Code, in the rates of pay under the

13 "(I) as a result of a determination under

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This Act shall take effect on
January 1, 2001, and shall apply with respect to any pay
adjustment taking effect on or after that date.
