A BILL

To provide for a biennial budget process and a biennial appropriations process and to enhance oversight and the responsibility, efficiency, and performance of the Federal Government.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Budget Responsibility
5 and Efficiency Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REVISION OF TIMETABLE.**

2 Section 300 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974
 3 (2 U.S.C. 631) is amended to read as follows:

4 “TIMETABLE

5 “SEC. 300. (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided by
 6 subsection (b), the timetable with respect to the congres-
 7 sional budget process for any Congress (beginning with
 8 the One Hundred Seventh Congress) is as follows:

“First Session	
“On or before:	Action to be completed:
First Monday in February	President submits budget recommendations.
February 15	Congressional Budget Office submits report to Budget Committees.
Not later than 6 weeks after budget submission.	Committees submit views and estimates to Budget Committees.
April 1	Budget Committees report concurrent resolution on the biennial budget.
May 15	Congress completes action on concurrent resolution on the biennial budget.
May 15	Biennial appropriation bills may be considered in the House.
June 10	House Appropriations Committee reports last biennial appropriation bill.
June 30	House completes action on biennial appropriation bills.
August 1	Congress completes action on reconciliation legislation.
October 1	Biennium begins.
“Second Session	
“On or before:	Action to be completed:
February 15	President submits budget review.
Not later than 6 weeks after President submits budget review.	Congressional Budget Office submits report to Budget Committees.
The last day of the session	Congress completes action on bills and resolutions authorizing new budget authority for the succeeding biennium.

9 “(b) SPECIAL RULE.—In the case of any first session
 10 of Congress that begins in any year immediately following
 11 a leap year and during which the term of a President (ex-

cept a President who succeeds himself) begins, the following dates shall supersede those set forth in subsection (a):

SEC. 3. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET AND IMPOUNDMENT CONTROL ACT OF 1974.

(a) DECLARATION OF PURPOSE.—Section 2(2) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 621(2)) is amended by striking “each year” and inserting “biennially”.

(b) DEFINITIONS.—

(1) BUDGET RESOLUTION.—Section 3(4) of such Act (2 U.S.C. 622(4)) is amended by striking “fiscal year” each place it appears and inserting “biennium”.

(2) BIENNIUM.—Section 3 of such Act (2 U.S.C. 622) is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

1 “(11) The term ‘biennium’ means the period of
 2 2 consecutive fiscal years beginning on October 1 of
 3 any odd-numbered year.”.

13 (ii) striking “the fiscal year beginning
 14 on October 1 of such year” the first place
 15 it appears and inserting “the biennium be-
 16 ginning on October 1 of such year”; and

17 (iii) striking “the fiscal year beginning
 18 on October 1 of such year” the second
 19 place it appears and inserting “each fiscal
 20 year in such period”;

21 (B) in paragraph (6), by striking “for the
 22 fiscal year” and inserting “for each fiscal year
 23 in the biennium”; and

1 (C) in paragraph (7), by striking “for the
2 first fiscal year” and inserting “for each fiscal
3 year in the biennium”.

4 (2) ADDITIONAL MATTERS.—Section 301(b)(3)
5 of such Act (2 U.S.C. 632(b)) is amended by strik-
6 ing “for such fiscal year” and inserting “for either
7 fiscal year in such biennium”.

8 (3) VIEWS OF OTHER COMMITTEES.—Section
9 301(d) of such Act (2 U.S.C. 632(d)) is amended by
10 inserting “(or, if applicable, as provided by section
11 300(b))” after “United States Code”.

12 (4) HEARINGS.—Section 301(e)(1) of such Act
13 (2 U.S.C. 632(e)) is amended by—

14 (A) striking “fiscal year” and inserting
15 “biennium”; and

16 (B) inserting after the second sentence the
17 following: “On or before April 1 of each odd-
18 numbered year (or, if applicable, as provided by
19 section 300(b)), the Committee on the Budget
20 of each House shall report to its House the con-
21 current resolution on the budget referred to in
22 subsection (a) for the biennium beginning on
23 October 1 of that year.”.

8 Congressional Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 643) is
9 amended—

10 (1) by striking “for a fiscal year” and inserting
11 “for a biennium”;

12 (2) in paragraph (1), by striking “first fiscal
13 year” and inserting “either fiscal year in the bien-
14 nium”;

15 (3) in paragraph (2), by striking “that fiscal
16 year” and inserting “either fiscal year in the bien-
17 nium”; and

18 (4) in the matter following paragraph (2), by
19 striking “that fiscal year” and inserting “the appli-
20 cable fiscal year”.

21 **SEC. 4. PAY-AS-YOU-GO IN THE SENATE.**

22 Subparagraphs (A), (B), and (C) of section 202(b)(2)
23 of House Concurrent Resolution 67 (104th Congress) are
24 amended to read as follows:

1 “(A) The period of the biennium covered
2 by the most recently adopted concurrent resolu-
3 tion on the budget.

4 “(B) The period of the first six fiscal years
5 covered by the most recently adopted concur-
6 rent resolution on the budget.

7 “(C) The period of the four fiscal years
8 following the first six fiscal years covered by the
9 most recently adopted concurrent resolution on
10 the budget.”.

11 **SEC. 5. AMENDMENTS TO TITLE 31, UNITED STATES CODE.**

2 beginning with the One Hundred Seventh Congress, the
3 President shall transmit to the Congress, the budget for
4 the biennium beginning on October 1 of such calendar
5 year. The budget transmitted under this subsection shall
6 include a budget message and summary and supporting
7 information. The President shall include in each budget
8 the following:”.

22 1105(a)(9)(C) of title 31, United States Code, is
23 amended by striking “the fiscal year” and inserting
24 “each fiscal year in the biennium”.

1 (5) FUNCTIONS AND ACTIVITIES.—Section
2 1105(a)(12) of title 31, United States Code, is
3 amended in subparagraph (A), by striking “the fis-
4 cal year” and inserting “each fiscal year in the bien-
5 nium”.

7 place it appears and inserting “each fiscal year in
8 the biennium for”;

1 **SEC. 6. TWO-YEAR APPROPRIATIONS; TITLE AND STYLE OF**
2 **APPROPRIATIONS ACTS.**

3 Section 105 of title 1, United States Code, is amend-
4 ed to read as follows:

5 **“§ 105. Title and style of appropriations Acts**

6 “(a) The style and title of all Acts making appropria-
7 tions for the support of the Government shall be as fol-
8 lows: ‘An Act making appropriations (here insert the ob-
9 ject) for each fiscal year in the biennium of fiscal years
10 (here insert the fiscal years of the biennium).’.

11 “(b) All Acts making regular appropriations for the
12 support of the Government shall be enacted for a biennium
13 and shall specify the amount of appropriations provided
14 for each fiscal year in such period.

15 “(c) For purposes of this section, the term ‘biennium’
16 has the same meaning as in section 3(11) of the Congres-
17 sional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (2
18 U.S.C. 622(11)).”.

19 **SEC. 7. MULTIYEAR AUTHORIZATIONS.**

20 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title III of the Congressional
21 Budget Act of 1974 is amended by adding at the end the
22 following new section:

23 “AUTHORIZATIONS OF APPROPRIATIONS

24 “SEC. 316. (a) POINT OF ORDER.—It shall not be
25 in order in the House of Representatives or the Senate
26 to consider any bill, joint resolution, amendment, motion,

1 or conference report that authorizes appropriations for a
 2 period of less than 2 fiscal years, unless the program,
 3 project, or activity for which the appropriations are au-
 4 thorized will require no further appropriations and will be
 5 completed or terminated after the appropriations have
 6 been expended.”.

7 (b) AMENDMENT TO TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The
 8 table of contents set forth in section 1(b) of the Congres-
 9 sional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is
 10 amended by adding after the item relating to section 315
 11 the following new item:

“Sec. 316. Authorizations of appropriations.”.

 14 United States Code, is amended—

15 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “September
 16 30, 1997” and inserting “September 30, 2000”;

17 (2) in subsection (b)—

18 (A) by striking “at least every three years”
 19 and inserting “at least every 4 years”; and

20 (B) by striking “five years forward” and
 21 inserting “six years forward”; and

22 (3) in subsection (c), by inserting a comma
 23 after “section” the second place it appears and add-
 24 ing “including a strategic plan submitted by Sep-

1 tember 30, 1997 meeting the requirements of sub-
2 section (a)’’.

3 (b) BUDGET CONTENTS AND SUBMISSION TO CON-

24 (E) by adding after paragraph (6) the fol-
25 lowing:

1 “(7) cover a 2-year period beginning with the
2 first fiscal year of the next biennial budget cycle.”;

3 (2) in subsection (d) by striking “annual” and
4 inserting “biennial”; and

5 (3) in paragraph (6) of subsection (f) by strik-
6 ing “annual” and inserting “biennial”.

7 (d) MANAGERIAL ACCOUNTABILITY AND FLEXI-
8 BILITY.—Section 9703 of title 31, United States Code, re-
9 lating to managerial accountability, is amended—

10 (1) in subsection (a)—

11 (A) in the first sentence by striking “an-
12 nual”; and

13 (B) by striking “section 1105(a)(29)” and
14 inserting “section 1105(a)(28)”;

15 (2) in subsection (e)—

16 (A) in the first sentence by striking “one
17 or” before “years”;

18 (B) in the second sentence by striking “a
19 subsequent year” and inserting “for a subse-
20 quent 2-year period”; and

21 (C) in the third sentence by striking
22 “three” and inserting “four”.

23 (e) PILOT PROJECTS FOR PERFORMANCE BUDG-
24 ETING.—Section 1119 of title 31, United States Code, is
25 amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (1) of subsection (d), by strik-
2 ing “annual” and inserting “biennial”; and

3 (2) in subsection (e), by striking “annual” and
4 inserting “biennial”.

5 (f) STRATEGIC PLANS.—Section 2802 of title 39,
6 United States Code, is amended—

7 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “September
8 30, 1997” and inserting “September 30, 2000”;

9 (2) in subsection (b), by striking “at least every
10 three years” and inserting “at least every 4 years”;

11 (3) by striking “five years forward” and insert-
12 ing “six years forward”; and

13 (4) in subsection (c), by inserting a comma
14 after “section” the second place it appears and in-
15 serting “including a strategic plan submitted by
16 September 30, 1997 meeting the requirements of
17 subsection (a)”.

18 (g) PERFORMANCE PLANS.—Section 2803(a) of title
19 39, United States Code, is amended—

20 (1) in the matter before paragraph (1), by
21 striking “an annual” and inserting “a biennial”;

22 (2) in paragraph (1), by inserting after “pro-
23 gram activity” the following: “for both years 1 and
24 2 of the biennial plan”;

1 (3) in paragraph (5), by striking “and” after
2 the semicolon;

3 (4) in paragraph (6), by striking the period and
4 inserting “; and”; and

5 (5) by adding after paragraph (6) the following:

6 “(7) cover a 2-year period beginning with the
7 first fiscal year of the next biennial budget cycle.”.

8 (h) COMMITTEE VIEWS OF PLANS AND REPORTS.—
9 Section 301(d) of the Congressional Budget Act (2 U.S.C.
10 632(d)) is amended by adding at the end “Each committee
11 of the Senate or the House of Representatives shall review
12 the strategic plans, performance plans, and performance
13 reports, required under section 306 of title 5, United
14 States Code, and sections 1115 and 1116 of title 31,
15 United States Code, of all agencies under the jurisdiction
16 of the committee. Each committee may provide its views
17 on such plans or reports to the Committee on the Budget
18 of the applicable House.”.

19 (i) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

20 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendments made by
21 this section shall take effect on March 1, 2000.

22 (2) AGENCY ACTIONS.—Effective on and after
23 the date of enactment of this Act, each agency shall
24 take such actions as necessary to prepare and sub-

1 mit any plan or report in accordance with the
2 amendments made by this Act.

3 **SEC. 9. BIENNIAL APPROPRIATIONS BILLS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title III of the Congressional
5 Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 631 et seq.) is amended
6 by adding at the end the following new section:

7 “CONSIDERATION OF BIENNIAL APPROPRIATIONS BILLS

8 “SEC. 317. It shall not be in order in the House of
9 Representatives or the Senate in any odd-numbered year
10 to consider any regular bill providing new budget authority
11 or a limitation on obligations under the jurisdiction of any
12 of the subcommittees of the Committees on Appropria-
13 tions for only the first fiscal year of a biennium, unless
14 the program, project, or activity for which the new budget
15 authority or obligation limitation is provided will require
16 no additional authority beyond 1 year and will be com-
17 pleted or terminated after the amount provided has been
18 expended.”.

19 (b) AMENDMENT TO TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The
20 table of contents set forth in section 1(b) of the Congres-
21 sional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is
22 amended by adding after the item relating to section 316
23 the following new item:

“Sec. 317. Consideration of biennial appropriations bills.”.

1 **SEC. 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 Except as provided in section 8, this Act and the
3 amendments made by this Act shall take effect on January
4 1, 2001, and shall apply to budget resolutions and appro-
5 priations for the biennium beginning with fiscal year
6 2002.

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
